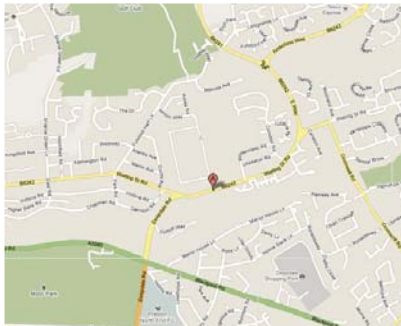

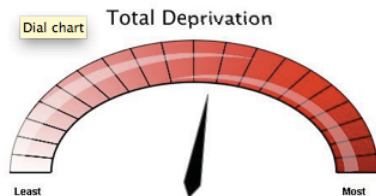

What is it like in your neighbourhood?

How does your neighbourhood or area compare with your local authority, or with England as a whole?

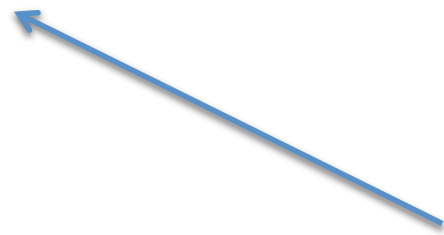
